Stage 3 Guiding Principles:

All stages of the education restart plan will continue to be guided by health and safety guidelines, measures, protocols and orders, as well as the principles developed for continuity of learning during the pandemic:

- 1. Maintain a healthy and safe environment for all students, families and employees.
- 2. Provide the services to support children of essential workers.
- 3. Support for students who may need special assistance.
- 4. Provide continuity of educational opportunities for all students.

Stage 3 Restart Plan:

- Children in Kindergarten to Grade 5: in-class learning 2 days per week, supplemented with remote instruction on Fridays.
- Children in Grades 6 to 12: remote learning supplemented with up to 20% in-class instruction (i.e., tutorials, seminars, small group instruction).
- Children of essential workers (aged 5-12) will have the option to attend school 5 days per week.
- students with disabilities/diverse abilities and students needing additional supports may be provided with extra opportunities.
- Families who decide not to send their children to class: continued remote instruction until the end of the 2019/20 school year.

Continuity of Learning:

The district will be organizing instruction in the following manner:

- Kindergarten to Grade 5
 - Beginning June 1, we welcome students back to school on a part time, voluntary basis. As teachers will be shifting to in-class instruction, remote learning will continue but on a reduced basis. Here are the big ideas:
 - All students will be offered face to face learning support and instruction on a scheduled and part time basis.
 - The school population will be divided into two, with half the population attending face to face instruction on Monday and Tuesday, and the other half attending classes Wednesday and Thursday.
 - All students will continue to have access to some online learning, provided once a week on Friday.
 - For some students, additional supports will be needed and offered. Students who require additional supports will be invited to attend extra individualized and/or small group instruction lessons.
 - A small number of students (children of essential service workers) will be able to attend school full time if needed.
- Grades 6 to 12

- Beginning June 1, we welcome students back to school on a part time, voluntary basis.
 With remote learning continuing to be the main form of instruction, teachers will also be working from school to provide tutorial sessions for students to attend. Here are the big ideas:
- All students will continue to receive online learning as their main source of instruction.
- At any one point there will only be 20% of the student population attending.
- All students will be offered tutorial learning support and instruction on a scheduled and part time basis.
- For some students, additional supports will be needed and offered. Students who require additional supports will be invited to attend extra individualized and/or small group instruction lessons.
- A small number of students (children of essential service workers) will attend school full time.
