Inclusive Education Committee – Alicia Fleetham

- November 9 was the first meeting of the year. There were some staffing changes within Student Services including the addition of a physiotherapist, a position which the district has never had before which will help alleviate some of the demands on the Occupational Therapists
- There is now a teacher that goes on reserve to support students there. A short summary was provided on why land acknowledgments are valuable: they restore power to the original peoples in the territory that in the past has been taken away
- There is a 2 week wait time imposed for students wishing to access the transitions program, with the exception of secondary students whom can only switch between octets, the reason for this is as follows:
 - The caseload for those teachers is too high and the district is working on redistributing the work
 - The district wants to ensure students and parents are sure about their decision as they are unable to accommodate regular switching between in class and transitions
 - The classroom teacher is to be supporting their student for the 2 week waiting period time just as they would if the student were to be away on holiday or sick

- Today Jennifer Whiteside was appointed the new Minister of Education, she is a new MLA and was previously the secretary-business manager and chief spokesperson for the Hospital Employees union

- On November 9th DPAC sent a letter to the District Administration advocating for online learning at the Secondary School level. The response indicated there would be nothing additional being offered unless we go back to Stage 3.
- Diane & Michelle met with the CTA on Friday November 13th. Their membership has many of the same concerns as DPAC. They would like to see reduced class sizes, an enhanced mask policy and better online learning options. They have also been trying to get a meeting with Fraser Health to discuss the delays in reporting. We will be meeting again in January.
- On Sunday November 15th DPAC sent an email to the Board of Education asking them to help encourage the use of masks. Although we understand that they are unable to mandate them due to public health restrictions we felt they could be doing more to create a culture where it is encouraged.
- On Friday November 20th Michelle had a phone meeting with Rohan.
 - Rohan, Paula Jordan, Kirk Savage, & David Manuel will be attending our DPAC meeting December 10th to get parent feedback on the Strategic plan. The existing one expires in June.

5.1 Roundtable on Letter to the Minister of Education

- There are three options for the letter. DPAC will draft letter for review once the direction is decided:
 - Do nothing
 - Write letter to Minister of Education recommending Special Advisor/Committee to oversee the Board
 - Write letter to Minister of Education asking them to dismiss the Board
- In May 2020 DPAC sent a letter asking for a Special Advisor, but no action was taken. This was right before schools reopened due to COVID-19 so it may not have been a priority, and new events have transpired since then.
- Discussion took place regarding the options given and possible alternatives to them. There are concerns about the Board being dismissed fully as all current trustees could run for re-election again and we could have the same board again, the majority of trustees are working hard and doing the jobs they were



elected to do, and a special advisor coming in that doesn't know our district. There are also concerns that not asking for the board to be dismissed gives poor optics, as if we're condoning such behavior and not setting a good example for our children

A majority of members present supported the third option, a letter asking the Minister of Education to dismiss the Board but would like to present the letter to their PACs before it is sent. A dissolution of the board letter will be drafted and sent to DPAC reps to give to their PACs, and then DPAC reps will vote at the next meeting on whether it is sent or not.
