#### Mission Statement:

### Objectives:

**Enhance Parent Engagement:** Promote parent participation in school-related activities and decision-making processes through advocacy, communication, support, and education.

**Strengthen PAC Support:** Provide training, resources, and networking opportunities to support PACs across all schools in the district.

**Advocate for Student Success:** Act as a unified voice for parents to advocate for improved educational policies, programs, and funding.

**Improve Communication:** Facilitate effective communication between parents, schools, and the district through regular updates, meetings, and forums.

#### **Environment Scan:**

The Chilliwack School District serves a diverse population of students and parents. The district's rapid growth presents both opportunities and challenges. As a central body, DPAC can help bridge communication gaps, address common concerns, and provide a platform for all parents to voice their opinions.



### Services and Programs:

**Winter:** Host monthly meetings and parent workshops while furthering advocacy efforts.

**Spring:** Connect and collaborate with PACs and parents to begin to develop a comprehensive advocacy strategy for the next school year.

**June:** Evaluate progress and set new goals for the upcoming year.

By engaging parents, advocating for educational improvements, and providing valuable resources, we aim to make a meaningful impact in our community.

- District committees are the Advisory Committee for Inclusive Education (ACIE), the Educational Policy Advisory Committee (EPAC) which is on hold until it is needed to review policy, the Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Accessibility Committee (IDEA), and the Budget Committee.
- Community Committees we hold seats on are Chilliwack Healthier Community Committee (CHC), Chilliwack Child and Youth Committee (CYC), Middle Years Committee, and the Sexuality and Gender Equity Committee (SAGE).



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- The first meetings for the Budget Committee, IDEA and ACIE have not been held yet.
- CHC:

  - Food Council is working on keeping the Free Food Resource document updated. <u>Linked here</u>. PLEASE share with your PACs, have your Admin share, Print and Pin on your community / PAC boards etc. There are a lot of folks struggling that you may not realize. Hunger affects education outcomes!
  - Last year was their biggest year of need, and they are already up 70k
     YTD.
  - Under CHC is the Chilliwack Child and Youth Committee (CYC). Currently, DPAC does not have a seat on Early Years, though the information may be relevant to our members. We have a seat on Middle Years, which is vacant. If you would like to attend the meetings, please let us know! dpac@sd33.bc.ca https://childandyouth.com/
    - At September's CYC meeting, Cristal Biela shared about Positive & Adverse Childhood Experiences and moving upstream in our work. We will have four Indigenous partner presentations this year in addition to four non-indigenous partner presentations. Planning for the 2025 Annual Conversation on Chilliwack's Children & Youth will begin in November.
      - 1. Early Years:
        - ★ The focus for this year is "Thrive to 5", with an intended increase in tier 2-3 referrals and a review of how to support families differently.
        - ★ An online calendar of universal free drop-in programming has been created for public use.
        - **★** Early Years Fair will be on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> May 2025.
      - 2. Middle Years:
        - ★ Middle Years strategic plan will be updated, and the Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) data will be presented to the committee at the October meeting.
        - ★ There is discussion about having youth's voice on the committee and connecting with CYCs in schools to create focus groups for youth.
