Transitions Grade 5-6 What to Expect in Middle School?

Grade 5/6 Transition is designed to help students navigate the transition between elementary and middle school. This course will touch on personal responsibility, skill building and relationships. Some objectives include building confidence, enhancing a positive attitude toward learning and engaging in the new curriculum's Core Competencies.

Coding for Kids Grade 4-5



This course will develop and apply your child's coding and computational thinking skills while staying active at the same time. This course will teach your child the Scratch programming language and how to apply it in a variety of situations (animation, game design and real-world application). Collaboration with peers is built into the course as a fundamental part of the coding process.

Physical activities will be part of each day so students should wear proper running shoes.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

For students in Grades 6 to 9 for the 2025-26 School Year

Fine Arts Grade 6-9

This course is designed for students to explore and experience creative expression and to develop a greater appreciation for the Visual Arts. While learning about the elements and principles of design, students will develop their sketching, drawing and painting skills.

This course is open to all students who would like to participate in a fun and creative atmosphere.

Performing Arts Grade 6-9

This course develops skills for musical theater performances, integrating drama, music, and dance from the BC Arts Curriculum. Students practice singing, movement (choreography), gestures, speech, improvisation, and character development while building concentration, trust, and teamwork. The course will focus on preparing a mini musical for a final performance. It includes team-building exercises, drama games, acting techniques, vocal and physical warm-ups, and basic singing skills. Homework involves practicing lines and music readying the students for their final performance.

Academic Strategies for ELL 10

After successful completion of the course, student will earn 4 credits towards graduation.

Technology Explorations 10

Open to students entering Grade 10, 11 or 12 in September 2025.

Participate in a 2-week Carpentry course and learn the basics of Western Stick Frame Construction, Electrical and Plumbing. Then complete a 2-week Welding unit and explore Oxy-Acetylene Welding, MIG Welding and Stick Welding.

After successful completion of the course, students will earn 4 credits towards graduation.

Jewellery Making 10

Open to students entering Grade 10, 11, or 12 in September 2025.

This course provides an engaging, skill-building opportunity for students who enjoy working with their hands but may not be drawn to traditional ADST courses like metalwork, woodwork, or automotive. Through this program, students engage in the design process, transforming their ideas into unique pieces they can wear, gift, or even sell. The course is designed with Universal Design for Learning (UDL) principles, ensuring access points for all learners.

After successful completion of the course, student will earn 4 credits towards graduation.

INDIGENOUS SUMMER PROGRAM

Indigenous Summer Learning Program 1-5

Open to all students with priority given to Indigenous Students in Grades 1 – 5 (First Nations Status, Non-Status, Metis, Inuit)

In this setting, your child will build cultural connections by exploring our community, learning outdoors, and participating in cultural activities. This is an activity-based program which provides daily activities and physical literacy education. Students should wear appropriate running shoes.

This program will strengthen your child's Literacy and Numeracy skills through place-based instruction and programming. Utilizing the First Peoples Principles of Learning, this place-based approach immerses students in local culture, landscapes and experiences that will provide an engaging experience to enhance literacy and numeracy skills.
